FIRST YEAR EXPERIENCE

The first year of college is a time of transition for every student, and the First Year Experience program is ready to help new students feel at home on campus, connect them with resources and help build their skills for success at UW-Platteville. Our office provides guidance for both students and their families in their transition to the campus community, including New Student Experience and Transfer Student Experience, First Year Experience courses, and student-led academic success presentations. Because we collaborate with other offices on campus, we also serve as a resource and referral agent for any questions or issues that arise.

TUTORING SERVICES

Tutoring Services provides individual and drop-in tutoring in a variety of courses. Tutoring provides an opportunity for students to engage in collaborative learning conversations that will clarify course material, increase retention of critical concepts, improve study habits and assist in achieving academic goals.

ACADEMIC COACHING

An academic coach can help students examine their academic concerns or perceived barriers to success. The coach provides guidance in areas like time management, procrastination, test preparation, study strategies and goal setting. Working with each student's individual needs, the coach helps to develop a plan of action for academic success. This service is available for students at any stage in their academic career, from first semester through graduation.

WRITING CENTER

Available to all UW-Platteville students, the Writing Center offers individual sessions with experienced fellow writers trained to consult on classroom assignments and other writing-related projects. Students can receive support and feedback at any stage in the writing process and for courses in any discipline.

ACADEMIC ADVISING

Students who are in select majors will receive individual guidance from our academic advisors in course selection, major exploration and degree planning. Our staff also serve students who are in transition from one major to another or those who would like additional assistance in developing a degree plan. Our Academic Advisors are also Academic Coaches who are able to assist students in their overall experience, helping them to succeed while at UW-Platteville.

TRANSFER YEAR EXPERIENCE

Transfer students arrive with college experience, but may not be familiar with UW-Platteville. Our office provides resources through on-campus partnerships, promotes success through information and services, and strives to help transfer students connect to the university and their academic programs. In addition to these services, most transfer students will be provided with academic advising and coaching services during their transition semester to the UW-Platteville campus.

TESTING CENTER

Located in 120A Karrmann Library, the Testing Center offers accommodation for students requiring alternatives to classroom testing. Students should consult with their instructors and/or Services for Students with Disabilities (<https://www.uwplatt.edu/department/services-students-disabilities/>) to see if this service fits their needs.

ACADEMIC INTERVENTION

Academic intervention provides a timely opportunity to resolve academic issues that may affect a student's success. Retention specialists regularly reach out to students with reminders or connections to learning resources. The Early Alert system allows instructors to identify students who are presenting patterns that may lead to academic difficulty in their courses. Our office is able to collaborate with other campus resources/professionals in order to provide proactive assistance to students and help them succeed in all courses.

NAVIGATE

Navigate makes it easier to cut through all the noise, highlighting for students important deadlines and events. Located at the crossroads of campus in the center of the academic community, the Markee Pioneer Student Center opened on April 1, 2002. "The Markee" is more than just a building, it's an experience! The Markee brings the campus community together to foster learning, create an inclusive community, serve the campus and the larger community, empower leaders, and celebrate the Pioneer Spirit. The Markee is the community center for UW-Platteville, where the convergence of academic and social life promote learning that goes beyond the classroom.

Contained within the 96,000-square-foot facility are a variety of services and programs designed to enhance the learning environment and strengthen the UW-Platteville community.

Computer workstations are placed throughout the Markee in a wide variety of settings.

Dining Services locations offer patrons an array of food and beverage selections to enjoy while attending events, or just relaxing in the Markee. Events include live music, comedians, leadership conferences, organizational meetings and educational speakers. Events are sponsored by the approximately 170 student organizations supported through the office space, common lounges and accessible technology in the Pioneer Involvement Center. Other services available at the Markee include the University Bookstore, Campus Card Office, and Information Center.

Cultivating enduring loyalty to the campus community, the Markee exhibits the heritage of the UW-Platteville campus. From the Alumni Lounge and Heritage Hall, community members can view the original Normal School bell, refurbished for the Markee as a commemoration of rich campus traditions. In the north area of Heritage Hall is a mural depicting historic buildings, locations and seals of campus. In the south windows of Heritage Hall is the University Seal. In the hallways adjacent to Heritage Hall, flags representing the nationalities of every student in attendance at UW-Platteville are proudly displayed to celebrate UW-Platteville's cultural diversity. Living on campus at UW-Platteville will provide students with special opportunities for growth, learning, fun and friendship. In addition, each of our branch campuses (Baraboo Sauk County and Richland) offer residence hall living.

Residence hall living is an integral part of the college experience. Student life at UW-Platteville strives to create an environment that supports individual choice, develops a sense of community and emphasizes individual and group responsibility. Each hall is a community of approximately 240-600 residents, with a total residence hall population of over 3,700 students. Halls are conveniently located, computer networked with wireless internet, equipped with streaming television, and well maintained. Full-time, professional resident directors supervise the student resident assistants who reside on each wing or floor. Staff members in each building are carefully selected, specially trained and willing to help students have a successful campus living experience.

UW-Platteville's main campus offers living learning communities (LLC's) and interest communities (IC's) as opportunities for students to combine their academic and co-curricular college experience. A unifying link within the residence hall community is the Residence Hall Association. Students elected to serve as representatives of this governance body promote an interest in and understanding of the campus environment and serve as a general forum for improving residence hall life.

UW-Platteville's main campus has an on-campus residence hall requirement that derives from a University of Wisconsin Board of Regents policy that requires freshmen and sophomore students to live in university residence halls during the academic year, unless they qualify for an exception and are officially released by the Department of Residence Life. After being admitted to the university, students receive an informational booklet which includes descriptions for residence halls and information explaining the procedure to request an exception to the on-campus residency requirement. This residency requirement is enforced, and students must provide the information necessary to confirm their compliance with it. Please direct any questions to the Department of Residence Life. UW-Platteville Student Health Services (SHS) provides a broad range of primary health care services for the Platteville campus. These include acute care for illness and injuries, mental health, health and wellness promotion, and opportunities for students to participate actively in their own health care. Physicians, nurse practitioners and registered nurses provide care for students.
