

# TESOL MINOR (NON-LICENSURE)

## TEACHING ENGLISH TO SPEAKERS OF OTHER LANGUAGES

This TESOL program provides students with the professional knowledge and skills necessary to teach English to speakers of other languages in the United States or abroad. The program offers three tracks to accommodate students with differing educational needs:

1. a TESOL licensure minor;
2. a TESOL minor (non-licensure), and
3. a TESOL certificate (non-licensure).

## PREREQUISITES

### World Languages Requirement:

Completion of a minimum of a one-semester college-level world language course or its equivalent.

### English Language Requirement:

A grade of "C" or higher in ENGLISH 1230.

The TESOL minor is designed for students who are interested in teaching English as a second or world language or pursuing a higher degree in TESOL, linguistics, applied linguistics or a related field.
