

INTERDISCIPLINARY PHILOSOPHY MAJOR, B.A.

The interdisciplinary philosophy major consists of 27 credits in philosophy and 15 credits in a companion discipline.

For the Bachelor of Arts degree, students are also required to complete a third semester in a world language (such as GERMAN 2240 or SPANISH 2840) and one English literature course (2000-level or above).
