DEPARTMENTAL WRITING REQUIREMENTS

In addition to the completion of 37 credits in psychology, all psychology majors must also successfully complete the following writing requirements:

1. Completion of ENGLISH 1130, ENGLISH 1230, and ENGLISH 3000 with a minimum grade of "C-", or verification of testing out of ENGLISH 1130 by the Department of Humanities (English)
2. Completion of Technical Writing (ENGLISH 3000) is required
3. Satisfactory completion of papers in those courses in which papers are required, which are evaluated for ability to communicate in written form as well as knowledge of psychological concepts

COURSE GRADE AND PREREQUISITE REQUIREMENTS

1. A grade of "C-" or better must be earned in all psychology courses that contribute to the 37 credit requirement for a psychology major.
2. A grade of "C-" or better is required in PSYCHLGY 1130 in order to enroll in PSYCHLGY 2230.
3. A grade of "C-" or better is required in PSYCHLGY 2230 in order to enroll in PSYCHLGY 3960 and PSYCHLGY 3970.
4. Elementary Statistics (MATH 1830) must be successfully completed ("D" or better) before taking Behavioral Research I (PSYCHLGY 3960).

PSYCHOLOGY EMPHASES

Emphases within the major: Completion of an emphasis, a career-related minor or a second major is strongly recommended.

AGING STUDIES EMPHASIS

This combination of courses will increase students' understanding of the biopsychosocial aspects of aging and will better prepare students for working with the aging population.
